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<p align="center"><u>Travel Brochure</u></p> <p>Make a travel brochure for modern Greece. Include monuments and buildings with a special interest for tourists. Create a leaflet about Greece and why it would be a good place for a holiday. What should your brochure contain? Look at travel brochures to help you find out. Find out about the where the Olympics began and compare the games/events then, to the games/events today</p> <p>Design your own Olympics. What events would you have? Could you create an advert persuading people to take part in your games?</p>	<p align="center"><u>Greek Temples</u></p> <p>Greek Temples were important buildings in Greece. They were beautifully designed, with wonderful architecture and brightly-painted sculptures. Research what they looked like and how they were built. Then create either a picture/painting of the temple, or you could create a 3D model.</p>
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<p align="center"><u>Adventure story</u></p> <p>Write an adventure story involving one of the Greek gods.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Choose one of the Gods and research them. E.g. Zeus, Hades, Athena, Aphrodite, Hera etc. Use a story mountain to create a plan for your story (opening, build up, problem, resolution, ending) Write a paragraph for each part of your story. 	<p align="center"><u>Labyrinth</u></p> <p>In the Greek myth, 'Theseus and the Minotaur', Theseus had to find his way through a labyrinth to find the Minotaur. Design and make your own Labyrinth. It could be made of straws/string/wood etc.</p> 	<p align="center"><u>Languages</u></p> <p>Find out some simple Greek phrases. E.g Hello, how are you? What's your name? etc. Can you make a poster to display them in Greek and English? If you can learn the pronunciation, can you try and teach us at school?</p>
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<p align="center"><u>Greek alphabet</u></p> <p>Find out about the Greek alphabet and present your findings in an interesting way. You could create a poster, leaflet, PowerPoint presentation etc.</p> 	<p align="center"><u>Greek food</u></p> <p>Cook some Greek food or a meal and write up the recipe and method you used. Can you include a photo of your creation too?</p>  	<p align="center"><u>A child's life in Ancient Greece</u></p> <p>Compare your life with a child living in the city of Sparta in Ancient Greece times. Do you think it was fun or hard work? Give reasons for your answer; remember to support your answer with evidence.
