# Multiplication Tables Check

It is an on-screen check consisting of 25 times table questions. Your child will be able to answer 3 practice questions before taking the actual check. They will then have 6 seconds to answer each question. On average, the check should take no longer than 5 minutes to complete.

## **How will the results be used?**

Schools will have access to all their pupils' results, allowing those pupils who need additional support to be identified.

## **Will I receive feedback on my child's check?**

Yes. Your child's teacher will share your child's score with you, as they would with all national curriculum assessments. There is no pass mark for the check.

## The amazing society of Ancient Greece

The ancient Greeks excelled in Europe over 2000 years ago. They helped build the foundations for modern society, created intricate pottery, a museum, myths and inspiring gods. In this text we will explore Greek myths, everyday life and Greek food.

### Greek Myths

There are lots of different Greek myths. There is often a lot of destruction in them. They have mainly merged from fact that they do not know how to describe. They have changed over time so that they are not exactly how they originated.

### Everyday life

Boys and girls mainly played with the same toys so they would often play together. Their father would attend the daily council, and so they would spend a large amount of time with their mother and help around the house. The father was often the head of the house and women would need permission for everything.

### Greek food

In Ancient Greece, the lunch was always a light meal and they would not eat much at that time. The ancient Greeks would eat bread, made from barley, which they would dip in wine to soften. Olive oil was extremely important to the Greeks because they did not have much of it.
