Nursery	Enjoy listening to longer stories and can remember much of what happens. Can find it difficult to pay attention to more than one thing at a time. Use a wider range of vocabulary. Reception	Listening, Attention and Understanding: Understand and work out how to listen carefully and why listening is important. Repeat what they have heard. Listen carefully to and learn rhymes, poems and songs, paying attention to how they sound. Talk about what they have heard, responding and sometimes asking questions so they can understand better. Listen to and talk about non- fiction books to develop a deep familiarity with new knowledge and vocabulary. Hold conversations and talk to their friends and teachers.	Listen to and join in with small group, whole class and one-to-one discussions. Share their own ideas.  Use new vocabulary they have learnt.  Explain why things might happen, making use of newly introduced vocabulary from a range of texts  Express their ideas and feelings about their experiences using full sentences. Ask questions to find out more and to check they understand what has been said to them.  Use talk to help work out problems and begin to explain how things work.  Develop social phrases.	Engage in story times - listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding.  Recall own stories and recounts to others.  Take part in wider school events / assemblies, with adult support.
