	<p>Word class Investigation Choose an event that we link with these two terms (harvest, Autumn, Remembrance, Guy Fawkes Night, Advent-or any others you can think of!). Create a list of the following four types of words that link to this event: VERBS, NOUNS, ADJECTIVES, ADVERBS. A thesaurus may help with this activity too!</p>	<p>Kitchen Science To link with our science topic on States of Matter, have a go at this simple kitchen experiment. When did they invade? When and what did they invent? Add any interesting facts on to your timeline with the dates.</p>
	<p>Roman Numerals Can you spot any Roman Numerals at home? Where are they used? Research and record the value of each symbol. Can you write your date of birth in Roman Numerals?</p>	<p>Roman Settings Look at some pictures of famous Roman settings. Can you describe this setting in detail? What interesting and engaging words can you include? You will need to use nouns, adjectives and verbs to create extended noun phrases.</p>	<p>Roman Art Mosaics – Can you find some examples of Roman mosaics. Look at the designs and patterns.
